IFRA 51 Conformity Certificate

Product: Summer Ale Fragrance Oil

This Certificate assesses the conformity of the fragrance mixture with IFRA Standards and provides restrictions for use as necessary. It is based only on those materials subject to IFRA Standards for the toxicity endpoints described in each Standard. This Certificate does therefore not replace a comprehensive safety assessment of the fragrance mixture.

COMPULSORY INFORMATION:

We certify that the above fragrance is in compliance with the Standards of the INTERNATIONAL FRAGRANCE ASSOCIATION (IFRA), up to and including the 51st Amendment to the IFRA Code of Practice (published June 2023), provided the final product is used in the following categories at a maximum concentration level. These limits may not be valid if our fragrance oil is used in conjunction with other materials that also contain these restricted substances. The total concentrations in the final product of all restricted substances should be taken into account when determining the maximum concentration permitted by IFRA.

<p>Category 11B: Products with intended skin contact but minimal transfer of fragrance to skin from inert substrate with potential UV exposure: Tights with moisturizers; Scented socks, gloves; Facial tissues (dry tissues); Napkins; Paper towels; Wheat bags; Facial masks (paper/protective) e.g. surgical masks not used as medical device; Fertilizers, solid (pellet or powder)</p>	2.6%
<p>Category 12 Products not intended for direct skin contact, minimal or insignificant transfer to skin: Candles of all types ; Laundry detergents for machine wash with minimal skin contact (e.g. Liquid tabs, pods); Automated air fresheners and fragrancing of all types e.g. concentrated aerosol with metered doses, plug-ins, electrical, incense, liquid refills (cartridge); Air delivery systems; Cat litter; Cell phone cases; Deodorizers/maskers not intended for skin contact e.g. fabric drying machine deodorizers, carpet powders; Fuels; Insecticides e.g. mosquito coil, paper, electrical, for clothing, excluding aerosols/sprays; Joss sticks or incense sticks; Dishwash detergent and deodorizers - for machine wash; Olfactive board games; Paints; Plastic articles (excluding toys); Scratch and sniff; Scent pack; Scent delivery system (using dry air technology); Shoe polishes; Rim blocks (Toilet)</p>	100%

Please note that in some cases a fragrance oil can be banned only in categories 1 and 6 while it is limited or free of use in other categories. This is due to the presence of one or several ingredients that are not Generally Recognized As Safe (GRAS). Peroxide levels are in compliance with IFRA and EU requirements.
